The 2020 CQC Children and Young People's Survey received feedback about the experiences of 27,374 children aged between 0 and 15, who were admitted to hospital during November 2020, December 2020 and January 2021. This includes responses from 13,261 children and young people aged 8 to 15, who directly gave us feedback about their care. Only 46% of children and young people said they were involved 'a lot' in decisions about their care and treatment.
