## **Speaker Biographies**

# Dr D Simkiss PhD, FHEA, FRCPCH, FRCP (Ed). Honorary Associate Clinical Professor in Child Health

Division of Mental Health and Wellbeing, Warwick Medical School, University of Warwick Doug Simkiss has worked with children in care for almost 30 years in practice, research and policy arenas. He has been designated doctor for Birmingham and Warwickshire, wrote a PhD on patterns of health service use in families where children enter care and has just completed the EXIT study on transition for children leaving care. He is currently Chair of the British Association for Community Child Health

## Hayley Tyson, Forensic Services Department, West Midlands Police

I have been part of the West Midlands Police Drug Expert Witness Team for 2 and a half years, and previously worked in a forensic drug laboratory for 3 years prior to joining WMP. My academic background is within forensics, having achieved a Bachelors and a Masters degree in this subject.

## Vincent Jones, Forensic Services Department, West Midlands Police

Police Officer for 28 years/Staff for 4 years: specialising in drug investigations, undercover operations and intelligence for most of that time.

I became a Drug Expert Witness in 2005 and have completed 2200 cases in this capacity. The cases range from simple drug supply to gang related violence, homicide, sexual offences, drug death (accidental and poisonings) and child abuse/neglect linked to drug use.

I was one of the founders of the West Midlands Police Drug Expert Witness Team in 2010/11 My academic background: BSc Hons Psychology. Accredit Member of the British Psychological Society (MBPsS). I have completed post-graduate studies and research in Drug Addiction, Neuroscience and Social Anthropology.

I am an experienced volunteer counsellor for a national bereavement charity: specialising in drug related deaths.

Andy Logie is the Adoption Head of Service, Ofsted Registered Adoption Manager for Birmingham and Leader Officer of Adopt Birmingham the city's Regional Adoption Agency. He has 24 years' experience working in children's social care.

In addition to his social work qualifications, he holds a Post Qualifying Award in Child Care and Child Protection, a Postgraduate Diploma in Law, is a Signs of Safety Leader, and currently chairs the Midlands Adoption Commissioning Programme.

Doctor Lynn snow is a community paediatrician working as Designated Doctor for looked after children for Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland and has worked with looked after children for over 20 years in various roles (including adoption adviser) in various areas of the country. She was until recently chair of the CoramBAAF National Health advisory committee and has focused on health records for children post adoption working with DHSC and NHSE.

She has been awarded a Churchill travel fellowship this year to look at post adoption depression.

She held a Fellowship with health education England East Midlands for two years looking at leadership in the SAS group of doctors. She has previously worked in West Africa in community child health. She is motivated by the desire to see high quality joined up services at all levels which ensure that the child looked after child remains the focus.

## Ellie Johnson, Health Consultant, CoramBAAF

Ellie is the health consultant at CoramBAAF. In that role she is responsible for facilitating the CoramBAAF Health Advisory Committee and training / networking events, support and advice services for CoramBAAF health group members.
